44. Selectmen discussed with the Road Agent the desire by John McNamara to remain on the town payroll.
45. Selectmen inquired as to the status of the prices to repair the brakes on the “02” dump truck. Came to find out the truck had been taken to Reeds to be fixed before asking for the Purchase Order, and in the discussion of getting three prices he never said that the job was getting done. He stated that the brakes had cammed over and a wheel had locked up on Washington Street so that the repair had to be done.
46. Board of Selectmen signed the permit approval to the State Department of Transportation for the paving at the Cornish Flat Fire Station.
47. Heather Meeks called to inquire the outcome of the hearing that was held. She stated that her opinion was that the Selectmen should have gotten more of a town wide vote before the unanticipated revenue is spent.
