

**MEETING MINUTES FROM THE SELECTBOARD MEETING HELD ON WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 18, 2006**

**Merilynn Bourne, Stuart Hodgeman and John Hammond present.**

Meeting opened at 8:00 AM

Selectmen met at the Callahan lot on Jackson Road to view the perimeter drain layout for the foundation. Mr. Callahan did not make the visit. Layout was not complete. Selectmen were not able to find any setback regulations for perimeter drains. Selectmen will ask Mr. Callahan to use a 10 foot setback for the outflow end of the drain. This is the same setback required for a septic drainage field. Jim Rogers, abutter, was informed of the decision.

A representative from Smith & Allen came in with a septic design to be stamped.

Priscilla Dean came in with her revised septic design for the town stamp.

Selectmen met with Town Treasurer, Bill Caterino, to discuss finances and the annual meeting with the DRA to set the tax rate. No date has been set for the meeting because the State is still waiting for the County budget.

Lenny Pillsbury met with Selectmen for a building permit. His septic design has been approved by the State. Selectmen explained how to fill the permit out.

Pamela Fecteau, from the Local Government Center, met with Selectmen to discuss the Town's fire and liability coverage.

Selectmen called Travis Callahan regarding the layout for his perimeter drain. Travis stated a change in the layout would be difficult but he will shorten the pipe.

Nancy Wightman and Janice Orion met with Selectmen to review business and ask for more detail in the minutes. Setting of the tax rate was discussed. The DRA has not contacted the Town regarding a meeting date for setting the rate.

Jim Rogers met with Selectmen to discuss the Callahan lot. Jim had questions about runoff water from the lot towards his lot. Selectmen will visit the site for a better understanding of the concern.

Nate Cass met with Selectmen to discuss the final contract language for the Windsor Dispatch Service Agreement. Nate recommends review by town counsel and our insurance carrier before signing. The Selectmen agree.
