Information regarding the process of withdrawing from an SAU  
from Mary Mayo of the NH DOE Division of Legislation, Laws, and Rules  
June 24, 2014, 11:00AM

Recommendations and information:

- Begin with any facts and figures that you have from the Plainfield collaboration committee, updating and verifying where needed.
- Key information includes what basic educational services we want/need and what we can afford based on our dwindling population and any other information required by statute or relevant to our district.
- Include impact on the rest of the SAU. (Our committee meetings need to be warned not only in Cornish, but in all towns of the SAU and any towns that could be potential partners or service providers).
- The State Board needs to approve the plan. They meet the second Thursday of the month.
- A public hearing on the plan needs to be held prior to submission to the State Board.
- The plan needs to be submitted to the DOE 30-45 days prior to putting it on the State Board agenda. The State Board has 60 days within which to place it on its agenda. Ms. Mayo felt that this could be done within a much shorter time.
- A public hearing needs to be held 15-30 days prior to the vote, although Ms. Mayo thought that a petitioned article was not held to the same standard. This needs to be verified.
- All this has to be accomplished in enough time to include any article to the warrant.
