That's why we've launched the Free the Trees Campaign to make sure that all landowners have the information, tools and resources they need to protect their woods.



According to the U.S. Forest Service, 58 million acres of forestland—and area larger than North and South Carolina combined—are threatened by bugs, diseases and weeds. Close to 500 non-native insects and diseases have already been introduced through U.S. ports, with a new tree-killing pest arriving every two to three years.

Create a Land Plan

You can't protect what you don't know. Setting up a Land Plan is an easy way to start to protect your woodland from bugs, weeds, and diseases. Go to www.MyLandPlan.org to set up a free account. You'll have immediate access to all the tools and information you need to map your land and develop a plan to keep your woods healthy and resistant to forest threats.



TIP

Consult a Pro

When you see a worrisome change in your woods, take pictures. Make notes on your trees' symptoms. Collect samples of suspicious insects. Then, talk to an expert like a Cooperative Extension agent or a professional forester. Depending on what's wrong, professionals like these can advise you on next steps for treating or eradicating the pest or disease. MyLandPlan.org can help you find an expert near you.

TIP

Watch for Signs

Know what's normal in your woods. Then, walk your land every month to check your trees' bark, limbs, buds, and leaves for changes that may signal trouble. A spot of yellow or brown, or some thinning needles, might be a disease or insect that threatens your woods.



TIP
